- Parent/Guardian must sign sheet and provide <u>phone number</u>.
- You must sign as well and provide your <u>cell phone number</u>. This is used to contact you over the Summer if there are any conflicts with your schedule.

It is a good idea to get either your required Fine Art or Technology Education credit out of the way as soon as possible. The courses available to you that meet these requirements are:

Fit for Life and Health are required half-credit electives and must be taken together in consecutive semesters. Another half-credit credit of health will be required during 11th grade.

All students must complete at least one of the following pathways – 2 years of World Language or a Career & Technology Education Completer Program. More information about the Completer programs can be found on pages 19-21 in the <u>High School Program of Studies</u>. Pathway options are:

- Business Management and Finance
- Computer Science
- NJROTC
- ProStart Food & Beverage Management
- PLTW Biomedical Sciences
- PLTW Pathway to Engineering
- World Language
- Teacher Academy of Maryland (TAM)

Approval for Courses

- Your current teachers will sign your Course Selection Sheets for most of your courses.
- Department Chairpersons will be set up in the Commons area from 7:15 to 7:25 a.m., Monday, December 19th through Thursday, December 22nd to sign Course Selection Sheets for other elective courses where you will need a teacher signature. You should get your Course Selection Sheet signed before 7:25 a.m.
 - Ex: Adv Art, Photography, Painting, Adv PE, Weight Training, etc.

When Selecting Your Courses, You Must Choose...

- Regardless of your plans for next year, you must sign up for <u>7 classes</u>
 <u>AND 3 alternate classes</u>.
- Most 10th graders will need to sign up for the following courses: English II, U.S. History, Math, Biology and 3 additional courses (Tech Ed, Fine Art, Fitness for Life and Health, graduation pathway and/or desired elective) AND 3 alternate electives
- IF YOU DO NOT SELECT ALTERNATE COURSES, MRS. GLADDEN WILL SELECT THEM FOR YOU.

Choose Wisely!

- Schedule changes will ONLY be made next year in <u>extreme</u>
 <u>circumstances.</u>
- For this reason, you must be very careful in course selection.
- Please wisely select the correct levels with the help of your parent/guardian and your current teachers.
- Carefully select your electives and alternates and make sure these are classes you will be happy with.

Before completing your course selection, please make sure you are familiar with the graduation requirements for Charles County Public Schools.

To be awarded a diploma, a student shall be enrolled in Charles County Public Schools (CCPS) and have earned a minimum of 23 credits that include the following:

To See Your Graduation Requirements

- 1. Go to your StudentVue
- 2. Open up Course History
- 3. Click to turn on Detail (button to the right)
- 4. Scroll to review your graduation requirements in the "remaining" column. This will tell you what courses you must sign up for.

Remember: ALWAYS, ALWAYS include a Math course to your total requirements because it is not included on this page!

- If you are planning to go to college after high school, it is important to take the most challenging courses possible. Most college admissions officers tell us a challenging course load is more important than earning straight A's in high school! College bound students should strongly consider taking at least one honors level course.
- Most colleges require students to have completed two high school credits in the <u>same</u> world language. Many colleges prefer students to have completed 3 credits of world language. A full year of world language taken in middle school does count for high school credit.
- Some students may wish to receive accolades such as a Charles County
 Certificate of Merit, CCPS Scholar, Maryland Scholar, and/or Academic Letter
 recognitions upon graduation. You can find additional requirements listed on
 page 5 of the Program of Studies.

Math and Foreign Language

- Remember you will be required to take a math course each year and earn 4 high school math credits while you are in high school in order to graduate.
- For any public college or university in Maryland, you will be required to take a math class at the Algebra II or higher level in your senior year of high school, even if you earned a math credit while still in middle school.
- In addition, most colleges require two credits in the same foreign language. Many colleges prefer 3 credits of foreign language.
