ATTENTION ALL 10TH AND 11TH GRADE STUDENTS

The filing period to be the next Student Member on the Charles County Board of Education is now open. The filing period will remain open until **Friday March 11, 2022 at 11:59p.m.**

If you are interested in becoming the next Student Board Member please fill out Student Member of the Board of Education (SMOB) application form and email it to Mr. Gary Winsett, regional advisor of the Charles County Association of Student Councils at gwinsett@ccboe.com. Please do so by 11:59p.m., Friday March 11, 2022.

You will also need to submit an Issue Statement, 500 words or less, identifying an issue of student concern and proposing a possible solution to the problem. This will need to be submitted to gwinsett@ccboe.com by 11:59 p.m. on March 14, 2022.

You will need to submit Candidate Meet and Greet video where you briefly introduce yourself and discuss your goals as a potential SMOB. This will need to be submitted to gwinsett@ccboe.com by 11:59 p.m. on March 14, 2022.

To access all necessary documents, including the candidacy form, the election timeline, and the election protocol packet, go to [CCASC - Home \(sharepoint.com\)](https://ccasc.sharepoint.com). You will need to log in using your student ccboe email address to access the SharePoint site.

The position of Student Member on the Charles County Board of Education (Student Board Member or SMOB for short) is the pinnacle of student leadership. The Student Member to the Board of Education in Charles County has voting rights on most matters. The Student Board Member is a full member of the school board, allowed to vote on all matters except for: legal appeals; personnel matters; collective bargaining; the hiring, salary, and evaluation of the Superintendent; the operating and capital budgets; and school openings, closings and boundaries.

QUALIFICATIONS:

- (1) Candidates for Student Member of the Board must be an enrolled student in Charles County Public Schools.*
- (2) Candidates must be in 10th or 11th grade at the time of their filing. Candidates must be an 11th or 12th grader for the school year of their term.*
- (3) Candidates must meet CCPS Academic Eligibility requirements.*

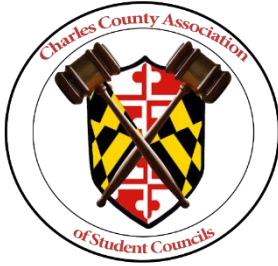
This means that the Student Board Member has an equal voice and vote to the adult members on the board. It is the job of the Student Board Member to represent the 27,000 students of Charles County at monthly School Board meetings other community events. The Student Board Member has the opportunity to work with the Charles County Commissioners and State Legislators on behalf of the Charles County students. The Student Board Member is a position of community leadership that requires interacting with the student they represent by attending school events such as plays, after-school clubs, and athletic competitions. The Student Board Member also has the opportunity to connect with the students they represent in school by going on school tours and visits.

The position of Student Member to the Board of Education is one of great responsibility and thus requires a large availability or time commitment. You will need to make sure you are aware of issues that come before the Board of Education to supply the voice of the students of CCPS. You will need to be available for several functions throughout the county be available for every work session and meeting of the Charles County Board of Education. Reminder that all CCPS eligibility requirements for extracurricular activities apply at all times. Please discuss your application process with your parent or guardian before submitting your application.

- Candidate Meet and Greet video Submitted: March 14, 2022 **by 11:59pm**
(in this video candidates introduce themselves and briefly discuss their goals)
- Primary Election (if more than 3 candidates): March 28-April 1, 2022
- General Election: May 9th, 2022 – May 20th, 2022
- Results Announced: May 27th, 2022

Charles County Scholarship Fund

The Charles County Scholarship Fund Inc. is a non-profit organization that provides scholarships to Charles County high school seniors. The following county groups – the Charles County Commissioners, Charles County Public Schools (CCPS), the College of Southern Maryland and the Charles County Chamber of Commerce – are always represented on the Scholarship Fund Board. All other members of the Board are selected from the community at large.

How To Apply

PLEASE NOTE: Application progress cannot be saved. Please have the following documents ready to UPLOAD when you apply. The application will open on Monday, January 10, 2022, and will close on **Tuesday, March 1, 2022**.

- **Academic Letter of Recommendation** – The letter of recommendation must be from a teacher, school counselor or other school administrator.
- **Personal Letter of Recommendation** – Must be from someone who knows you well. (Not a parent or other family member)
- **Personal Statement Essay** – Your essay is a statement regarding your academic and career objectives, goals and aspirations. Your student statement is very important, and the Scholarship Committee relies heavily on this statement. Please include the following: What are your educational and career goals? Why have you chosen these goals? How do you envision contributing to your community after you complete your education?
- **Resume** – The resume must include: 1. Work Experience 2. Extracurricular activities 3. Community Service activities during high school 4. Leadership positions and 5. School and Community honors and awards.
- If you want to be considered for need-based scholarships, you will need to provide a **copy of your 2022-23 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) Student Aid Report (SAR)**. (Confirmation page will be available to you once you complete the FAFSA). All information supplied will be treated as confidential.

FEDERAL STUDENT AID (FAFSA) FORM

- All scholarship applications must be completed and submitted by March 1, 2022.
- Late applications will not be accepted.
- Seniors should see their school counselor or their school's College and Career Advisor if they have any questions/concerns. **SCHOOL COUNSELORS COLLEGE AND CAREER ADVISORS**
- Please ensure you have all required documents ready to upload to the application prior to starting to complete the form.

It is a participatory program where each participant becomes a part of the operation of his local, county and state government. Boys State has been a program of The American Legion since 1935 when it organized to counter the Fascist inspired Young Pioneer Camps. The program was the idea of two Illinois Legionnaires, Hayes Kennedy and Harold Card, who organized the first Boys State at the Illinois State Fairgrounds in Springfield. Activities include legislative sessions, court proceedings, law enforcement presentations, assemblies, bands, chorus and recreational programs. High school juniors are selected by local American Legion posts to attend the program. In most cases, expenses associated with attending this program are paid by a sponsoring American Legion post, a local business or another community-based organization.
